Uses permitted in the Limited Business District as defined in Section 6. are as follows:

1. Those uses already allowed in the Limited Residential Recreational District — **YES**
2. Motel and lodging facilities not exceeding fifteen units — **PERMIT**
 Voted to vote by written ballot. The Moderator ruled a YES vote would be to amend this ordinance, and a NO vote would be to not amend it.

Whole number of votes cast were 138
 YES had 105
 NO had 33

Art. 11 - Voted to set the limit on receipt of taxes as November 30, with interest at 10% from then on.

Art. 12 - Voted to allow a 2% discount on taxes paid within 30 days after the commitment of taxes.

Art. 13 - Voted that the School Committee be authorized to NOT adopt a school lunch program at the Eddy School.

Art. 14 - Voted to take Excise tax balance from surplus for Snow and Ice Removal.

Art. 15 - Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to be used by the road commissioner as an expense account. He will be responsible for all road and snow removal work and shall maintain a telephone and receive all complaints about the same.

Art. 16 - Voted to raise and appropriate \$4000 for support of highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and to take \$5000 from Federal Revenue Sharing.

Art. 17 - Voted to raise and appropriate \$6000, and to take \$5000 from Federal Revenue Sharing for repairing and tarring of town roads.

Art. 18 - Voted to raise and appropriate \$2000 for fire departments responding to fires in town.

Art. 19 - Voted to raise and appropriate \$600 to help maintain a fire alarm system for the Edgcomb Fire Co., Inc.

Art. 20 - Voted NOT to change Edgcomb's fiscal year from January 1 - December to July 1 - June 30, beginning in 1980.

Art. 21 - Voted to postpone until after lunch.

Art. 22 - Voted to postpone until after lunch.

Art. 21 - Voted to amend Art. 21; The disposal of deceased animals in any form in an unsanitary fashion which may endanger the health of other animals or humans, or cause a public nuisance, shall be prohibited in the Town of Edgcomb.

The Selectmen shall be empowered to investigate complaints on such disposal, to fine offenders not more than \$1000 for each offense, and/or to oversee proper disposal thereafter.

Voted to adopt the following ordinance, as amended: The disposal of deceased animals shall be prohibited in the Town of Edgcomb without a permit from the selectmen. Offenders will be fined \$1000 for each offense.

Art. 22 - Regarding the money obtained from the sale of the Woodend property, it was voted to accept the amendment of Mr. Philip Chaney that the proceeds from the sale of Woodend Property be added to the Boat Fund Account for acquisition of property for public access to the water or other recreational use. The selectmen shall appoint a 5 member committee to study the location of said access.
