## **MINUTES**

Tuesday, Dec. 27, 2022 at 6:00 PM

- 1. **Approval of Minutes:** Ted motioned to approve the SB minutes of 12/2. Mike seconded. Approved 3/0. Mike motioned to approve the Assessors' meeting; Ted seconded. Approved 3/0.
- 2. New Business
  - Rep. H. Stover and MDOT held a meeting with Newcastle residents to discuss the need for safety improvements to made at the intersection of Cochran Rd and Rt 1. The Edgecomb SB attended this meeting. They also discussed the intersection of McKay Rd and Rt. 27 and need for improved signage and perhaps a turning lane. No commitments were forthcoming from the DOT. The group agreed that the new Florida T at the intersection of Rt 27 and Rt 1 works well.
  - Budget: Mike is interested in meeting on an alternate Monday after the first
    meeting of the new year to discuss the budget considerations the next fiscal year.
    He asked George Chase (as a member of the School Committee) to submit as
    soon as possible the final version of the new teachers' contract including the
    salary numbers.

  - **Update FOAA lawsuit:** Dawn reported that a Zoom meeting was held by the Judge, the Town Attorney, and Mr Harrington. During this meeting Mr Harrington made disparaging comments about Dawn Murray and told the Attorney to pass them along to her. Dawn feels this constitutes "indirect contact" and goes against the judge's restraining order ruling. Dawn said Mr Harrington has all materials that he requested

Despite a restraining order put in place by a judge in December, Mr Harrington continues to publicly harass Dawn to a point where she feels "unprotected and vulnerable." Ted motioned to accept Dawn's resignation with regret. Mike seconded. Approved 2/0. Dawn said she will continue to work on details related to her recent activities, including with the GA program.
