#### AOS 98 App

This issue's 1st page is dedicated to getting set up with our App. Please see page 2 for upcoming events to mark on your calendar. If you have a smart phone (an iPhone or an android), you should go to the App Store on your device and load our AOS 98 App. It's free, and it allows you to easily access Edgecomb Eddy's website. By loading our app, you'll be able to see Edgecomb Eddy news, search for documents, read live feeds, and receive push notifications. The push notifications would be used to alert families around important events or happenings, such as delays or cancellations, transportation changes, or reminders for events happening on that day. Follow the step by step directions below to load this app and stay easily informed about Edgecomb Eddy.



Step 1: Go to your App Store and search for "AOS 98".



Step 2: After loading the App, allow "AOS 98" to send you notifications.



Step 3: Select the settings icon in the top left corner of the screen.

Make EES your default school, turn notifications on for EES.

Receiving AOS 98 notifications would allow for you to stay informed about the whole district.



Steps 4 & 5:

Go to your phone's personal settings. Select notifications and make sure that you have your preferred notification style applied to the AOS 98 App. Banners and badges will allow for you to see notifications, and sounds will alert you when a notification has been sent to your phone.

PreK went on their first field trip to the apple orchard. We had a great time and learned all about how apples grow and then are made into cider. Each student picked their own bag of apples to bring home! Back in the classroom we have been learning some fall themed songs that are helping us count and move appropriately with our peers in a large group.

Now that October is here we have been spending some time learning about leaves and how they change color. Outside students have been encouraged to find different leaves on the playground. Students are also working hard to learn a correct pencil grip and we practice this with our "Crayon Song" each morning. The letters we worked on this week are A, T, V, X, Z. All these letters are made using the Big Line and Little Line from the wooden pieces. More about the wooden pieces was given out at the open house in the take home sheets I gave out.



#### Mrs. Garey's K/1

In our K /1 class we have had a great time learning about apples. We visited Biscay Orchard on Wednesday Sept. 26 with the Pre K class. We found a special tree in the orchard with many varieties grafted in place. Each child left with a bag of apples and a sample of cider. Art projects, science experiments, and stories about apples has been keeping us busy. We have enjoyed making apple volcanoes, apple play dough, apple biscuits and apple smiles. Fall is a wonderful time for apples! Working and eating! How great! Speaking of eating, we have had at least 7 different kinds of birds at our feeder. Even a squirrel has helped himself to some seeds.





Integrated Art Pre-K through Gr. 2 celebrated the changing season with leaf collection yesterday. Today we created beautiful art by making leaf rubbings and dipping them in beeswax. Next week we'll work more with balance and motion by assembling Nature Mobiles.

Mrs Currier's grades 1& 2 students are learning about the voyage of Christopher Columbus in Social Studies, and working to complete their 3D map of the voyage Columbus. Then in science students were able to learn about buoyancy by making the Nina, the Pinta, and the Santa Maria out of tin foil and seeing whose ship could hold the most weight. Great fun and engagement for all!

On Monday 10/1 the grades 1 & 2 classes went to Biscay Orchards for an educational apple picking field trip. The students got to learn about and see a grafted apple tree, as well as learn about the processes for cleaning, storage, and cider making. A fun field trip, and a thank you to your parent chaperones!





We are doing a great job transitioning into fall in 3rd and 4th grade! In Literacy we are learning about common and proper nouns, fragments and run-on sentences, and character traits! Each student in Literacy made a "Character Trait Tree" by using adjectives to identify traits about themselves. In Math we started our "Length of Day" project. Students are learning about graphing and data tracking by monitoring the sunrise and sunset times of each Tuesday. In Science we are learning about weather and climate after wrapping up our Water Cycle Unit. Lastly, in Social Studies, students are learning about the states in the West, Midwest, and Southwest. We are also gearing up for our sub, Mrs. Doody, to come in while Miss Crocker is at home with new baby Harbor!









#### News from the Rose Garden #2

Both grade 4/5 and grade 6 have begun our U.S. Government unit, learning about the three separate branches of government established by our founding document, the United States Constitution. In fact, some of the younger students are taking advantage of the sixth graders' trip to Chewonki by working on memorizing the Preamble to the Constitution while they're gone. Will anyone be brave enough to share it during a performance festival? Time will tell.

For the first time in my 18 years in Edgecomb I had the privilege of spending a day at Chewonki with the sixth grade. The kids were learning a lot about nature and themselves. It was wonderful, especially since the rain finally stopped before my arrival. While I was there we explored an estuary (with a LOT of mud) and learned about marine mammals in a classroom beneath a real whale skeleton. It was tough to pull myself away at the end of the day.

The Journeys program provides learning opportunities that span the Language Arts spectrum. Every unit of 5 lessons has an overarching theme. "We all need to communicate" is the theme for grade 6. Grade 4/5 has the theme "We never stop learning." Both themes are strong, positive messages.

Each Journeys level tackles the areas of grammar, spelling, reading comprehension, vocabulary, and writing at an increasingly complex level. In grammar we have been working on complete sentences, subjects and predicates, and sentence types. The spelling focus has been around long and short vowel sound spelling patterns. We have already worked with both fiction and nonfiction reading selections, and have covered a lot of ground in our individual reading goals. In fact, students are already presenting their first "Book Talks," an opportunity to practice public speaking and share some good book recommendations.


RtI groups have begun. A mixed group of third, fifth and sixth graders has had fun working on language arts skills with several different readers' theater opportunities.



It has been a busy and exciting last few weeks in the 4th, 5th and 6th grade science and math classes. Everyone has been working on learning new grade level concepts and has been challenging themselves.

The 4th and 5th grade math class has been exploring ideas about volume in many different ways including making rectangular prisms and filling them with cubes and using base-10 blocks to understand the connections between length, area and volume. In science, this class has recently begun a unit on matter. Students have lots of questions and seem excited to learn more about how the world around them works. We also have taken a few brain breaks to have a little fun. Check out the huge cup tower the girls in class built in the picture to the right.





The 6th grade math class has been working hard to learn and understand data collection, data landmarks, dot plots and how graphs can be constructed to be persuasive. In science, this class has just begun a unit on Earth's place in the universe. So far we have explored some of the connections within the Earth, Sun and Moon system. Most recently, we learned about the phases of the Moon and what causes them. Students showed what they have learned with a partner activity making the phases out of Oreo cookies! We of course enjoyed one or two of the cookies when we were done!



The Monday before last, we all arrived at school to find that both our butterflies had emerged over the weekend. All the classes went outside together in the morning to release them and let them begin their journey to warmer weather. Enjoy the pictures of our
