LAST DAY OF SCHOOL

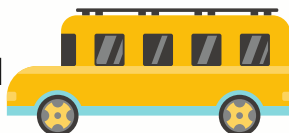
Thank you all for a wonderful year of growing and learning! Have a safe and happy summer!

QUICK CLASSROOM UPDATES

PRE-K

Pre-K has been busy over the last few weeks! We had fun on our field trips to Oak Point Farm, Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens, and the Boothbay Railway Village.

We have also been focusing more on play-based learning and have enjoyed trying new activities in small groups, as well as having some more outdoor playtime. We can't believe the year is coming to a close! I am so proud of how much these Pre-K kiddos have grown and will miss having them in class!

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten has had a wonderful month - and year - of learning! We have grown so much in our thinking that we now consider ourselves First-Graders-in-Training! We practiced thinking like zoologists and geographers when we went to the Maine Wildlife Park and used maps to go with our 3rd grade buddies to the different animal exhibits. 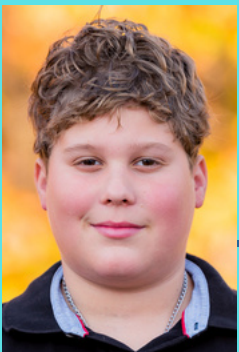
